



PUBLIC ENEMY #1



How did the round goby get here?

- The round goby appeared in the St. Clair River in 1990.
- The round goby spread to all of the Great Lakes by 1994.
- It is believed that the round goby came in the ballast water from a European ship.
- The round goby is native to the Black and Caspian Seas in Europe.

Why are round gobies a problem?

- · Round gobies are very aggressive fish.
- They can displace native fish and take over habitat.
- Round gobies reproduce very quickly, up to six times in a summer, and populations increase very quickly.
- They can also survive in poor quality water, which gives them advantage over other fish.
- Round gobies are nuisance to fishermen because they steal bait off of fishhooks, eat fish eggs, and compete with small fish for food

What do round gobies look like?

- They have a single suction cup-like pelvic fin.
- Young round gobies are solid slate gray.
- Adult gobies are 3-6 inches in length, although

they may get up to 10 inches long.

How do we control round gobies?

- There is little that we can do to eliminate them once they are established.
- Always drain water out of your boat, live well,

- and bilge before leaving water access.
- Do not throw unwanted bait into the water, place it in the trash.
- · Never dump fish from one lake into another.
- · Never use round gobies as bait.

MEMBERSHIP DUES FOR LSCWA

As your club membership person I'm writing this article to help members keep current with your dues. We are starting the 2022 year derbies with the April derby. You have to be a current member per derby rules to enter a fish. Before the start of a derby.

At the top of your monthly newsletter is an arrow pointing to your expiration of dues. The message of the arrow is a two prong notice of expiration for derbies, and membership. The derbies notice is a reminder to be paid before the derby in that month, per derby rules. The second part of the notice is for general club dues expiring at the end of the month.

An example of the expiration information under the arrow is month, year, type of membership such as 04,2022, S. This translates to April 2022 Single membership that will expire in that month.

You can renew a few different ways. One way is face to face meetings now that we have regular meetings. Second, the club web page, third, mailing a check to the post office. The club address is Lake St Clair Walleye Association PO BOW 130 St Clair Shores MI 48080. Hopefully this reminder will help members stay current with dues. The club is back to normal for 2022 and beyond.

CLEAN OUT THE FREEZER

(This is based on an article that appeared in the April 1999 issue of The Walleye World. The recipe was one I found after looking for Walleye Casseroles that were similar to some that members would bring to events from the Chistmas Party to the special summer tournaments. I cannot say whose recipe this one is similar to but it does not matter to members who want to try something different.)



WALLEYE BAKE CASSEROLE

1 lb. fish fillet drained

Crab Mixture

2/3 cup buttered melted

1 cup crushed herbal seasoned stuffing mix

6 oz can crab meat, drained (if frozen thaw and drain)

4 oz can mushroom stems and pieces, drained

1 egg

2 TB chopped fresh parsley

1/4 tsp. hot pepper sauce

Topping

1/2 of the Crushed Herbal Seasoned Stuffing Mix

2 tb butter melted

Place the stuffing mix in an ungreased 8" square baking dish. Arrange fillets over mix. In a 1 1/2 qt bowl mix the crab mixture ingredients. Sprinkle mixture over fillets.

In a preheated oven of 350 degrees bake for 30-35 minutes or until fillets flake.

Yields four (4) servings
