## LSCWA BYLAW CHANGE

LSCWA members there will be a vote at the July 2019 general membership meeting to revise our bylaws. Currently they state in Section 4: The Treasurer has the responsibilities to coordinate all income and disbursement of monies. He/she shall deposit all monies received by the organization into the appropriate Commercial bank accounts. The Treasurer shall be required to provide a detailed accounting of all financial transactions on a monthly basis. In addition, the Treasurer must provide the same for a quarterly audit to be submitted to the Board of Directors for their approval. A quarterly audit is to be done by a CPA.

The revision will be: "In addition, the Treasurer must provide the same for a yearly audit to be submitted to the Board of Directors for their approval. A yearly audit is to be done by a CPA."

Justification: Quarterly audits are not cost effective or required.

Some of the laws discussed are stated below.

For instance, "you are fishing in a boat with 3 others. You catch your limit, your next fish cannot go into live well, you must throw it back. Or: put your rods away.

(or) ...Two fishermen return to dock with 2- person limit. The Captain volunteers to clean, filet & freeze entire

catch. He drives home alone with boat and all the fish; (other guy leaves in his vehicle, to his home with no fish). Captain could get busted.

## HAVE YOU TRIED SLIDERS? *By Rich Benson*

Recently a member asked me about sliders for walleye fishing. Some people might ask. 'who would bring a bag of greasy burgers out fishing?' I assure you, that is not what we're talking about. Hooking up a slider to your line is easy, once you know what you need. A slider is just leader and crawler harness added to your existing line that is already set out with a planer board. What you need to do is attach an Offshore planer board clip 10-20' away from your planer board on the line going from your rod to the tip, thereby stopping it from traveling all the way out to your board. Next, bait the slider and attach it to the line, letting it out slowly and then releasing it to travel down the line to the stop.

Set up this way, you are now fishing an extra bait, which is extremely handy in areas of rod restrictions like Canada. Using this method is very popular with tournament anglers as well, where allowed such as our own May Madness. Crawler harnesses are typically run on sliders as there is usually hook point restrictions in place where the use of sliders is legal as well. Keeping the slider clipped onto the main line is also required when the fish is hooked. You simply reel the line in up to the clip, then grab the slider and bring it in hand-line style to the boat. Shorter leads are best with a slightly heavier weight than your main line to help reduce tangles.

# LESSONS LEARNED FROM MICHIGAN WALLEYE TOUR DETROIT RIVER

I personally believe that one of the fastest ways to learn to be a better angler is to surround yourself with great people and get out of your comfort zone. For my personal angling journey- and it is just that a lifelong journey- I decided that I wanted to fish tournaments to help grow in my abilities and knowledge of breaking down water. The 2019 Michigan Walleye Tour Detroit River event was one of my first steps in this direction. What made this event so special is that I was blessed to be able to fish it with family: my Dad and brother-in-law Calvin Doctor. The purpose of this article is to share some tips to help anglers become more adaptable and resilient when difficulties come your way. If you only get one thing from this article, just remember to never give up.

Our first day of practice was completely shot after discovering we had motor issues on the river. We had to immediately limp back to the launch and trailer up to return home and attempt to resolve the problems. Some of you may know this already, but days before the event my Dad just had finished moving his entire life into his new house. He was tired and sore but never once did he give up. Part of being a resilient person is knowing when to ask for help.

My dad knew that he couldn't tackle the motor issues by himself so he made a call to Bill Rose at Rose Marine Service in Algonac, MI. Rose Marine Service has been a long time supporter of our club and my Dad has worked with the Rose family for years for all of his marine needs. My Dad explained the situation to Bill Rose- his staff dropped everything they could to help us. Upon arrival to their location, within 30 minutes, the team at Rose had our problems resolved. They truly went above and beyond to help us before the tournament and I will never forget their kindness to us and dedication to the LSCWA. Billy Rose personally made sure all was well and wished us luck as we departed to head back home.

Our only day of practice was mentally draining. A critical piece of developing a program was to spot check a number of areas of the lower Detroit river by using sidescan sonar. The Ontario side of the river was chocolate milk, but we were able to locate an area that was stacked full of fish. The problem was that we couldn't get a single one to bite and didn't even land a fish for practice! In my opinion this was because they were hens and dumping eggs. Discouraged, we went to the rules meeting but knew that we could develop a game plan if we didn't give up. We didn't put a game plan together until minutes before we lined up for our flight to be sent off.

We went directly to the spot that we marked the most fish and they were still there. We made 1 pass handlining and landed a 4lb hen that was dumping eggs which confirmed my suspicion. Once at the top of the area where we marked fish during practice, we made a drift down vertical jigging in the muddy water- counter intuitive to our gut instincts. It sure did pay off. All of our fish came vertical jigging both days of the event. Calvin put together the program early by jigging "June Bug" split tail minnows which was perfect for muddy conditions. He also jigged up the biggest fish in our boat for the event which was just shy of 9lbs. At weigh in for day one, our basket was 25.71lbs which positioned us at 5th place for day 1. I cannot explain the emotions of the lows and highs I felt at this point- we went from thinking we were out of the game to sitting near the top.

I am reminded of some wisdom a great angler I look up to once shared with me, "Keep your head down. Focus on what you're doing and don't worry about the others. Focus on your plan and keep grinding at your spot." Day two we put together a basket of 23.2 lbs for a two day total of 48.91 lbs which placed us at 9th out of 125 teams. We couldn't believe it. This event taught me about mental toughness, keeping an open mind, and being resilient to overcome challenges.

My foundation for walleye fishing all came from the Lake St. Clair Walleye Association. I encourage everyone reading this article to get connected with our great members and ask plenty of questions. I would also like to thank the Saginaw Bay Walleye Club for putting on a great event and look forward to connecting more with their great members. We are all on a life long fishing journey and can learn something new everytime we're out on the water.


