

PLANKED SALMON

Item's needed:
Salmon fillet – skin off or on.
Cedar plank
Olive oil
Garlic salt
Pepper
Honey

Directions: Soak cedar plank for a couple hours in water...submerged. Preheat covered grill 350-400 degrees. Coat flesh side of fillet with olive oil, sprinkle on garlic salt and ground pepper to taste. Put plank on grill, leave for 3 minutes, then turn plank over. Lay salmon fillet on plank, skin side down. If no skin, drizzle some olive oil on plank then place salmon on plank, previously coated side up. Cover grill, cook for 12 minutes. No turning necessary.

After 12 minutes, drizzle fillet with honey, cover grill and cook for additional 3 minutes.

Remove from grill and enjoy some fine eating... fillet, not the cedar plank!

LETS GET PICKLING ADVENTURE #1

Just in time for the holidays how about making a jar of pickled eggs. Easy to do and tasty plus it can look festive in the jar while on the counter or in a bowl on the center of the table. Oh, and quick to make and the basic pickling takes only two days.

The Pickling Juice or Brine Ingredients and Instructions

1 can red beets & juice (or substitute 1 cup water)

1 cup distilled white vinegar

1/2 cup white sugar

1 level teaspoon salt

4 cloves

2 inch cinnamon stick

The beets can be optional. They are for adding the traditional rich red color that many like for that holiday look. The beets and the juice in the can do add a bit of beet taste but they also become pickled along with the eggs. Buy a can of whole or sliced beets. Whole beets can be cut into quarters and sliced beets used as is. However, if they are not wanted they can be skipped and a cup of water can be used instead.

Put all the ingredients in an appropriate sized pot and bring to a boil. Stir often to keep the sugar from starting to stick to the bottom before it has a chance to dissolve. When the pickling juice starts to boil take it off the heat. Leaving it on the heat will cause the vinegar to loose some of the taste and reduces its pickling strength. Let it start to cool off to room temperature but it can remain very warm.

Ahead of time, before starting the pickling juice, cook up a dozen hard-boiled or hard-cooked eggs. Once they are cooked and have cooled off enough to handle then it is time to peel them.

Have handy an already cleaned large jar. A quart canning jar will do. Regular mouth jars are OK though it will be a bit harder to get the eggs out when they are ready so using a wide mouth jar might be better for a party atmosphere.

Put the hard-boiled eggs into the jar. Most of the time if large sized eggs are used then the jar will hold 10 so the other two can be used for an egg salad sandwich. Pour the pickling solution over the eggs. Do not forget to get the cinnamon stick and cloves from the bottom of the pot and put them in with the eggs. If more liquid is needed to completely cover the eggs then use water.

Put the jar or jars in the refrigerator and leave there for at least 48 hours but an extra day helps the taste.

Notes for those who like to experiment...

*Pickled eggs can be left in the jar on the counter but if kept in the fridge they will last longer. *They will get a bit tastier the longer they sit in the juice. *The juice and then the eggs might pick up a golden brown color from the cinnamon stick and the cloves. *A pinch of crushed red pepper will kick up the pepper heat. *Or core out a green or red Jalapeno pepper and cut it into strips and use that for extra heat. *If skipping the beets but a red color is wanted then experiment with food coloring; a drop might be enough. *Or do two jars and put red food color in one and green in the other.

A bigger note...

*Try adding some of the small white onions, sometimes called Pearl or pickling onions. They are often found in the produce area in a bag. Some stores will also have them in bulk so only a few can be bought for experimenting. Place these onions a large pot of boiling water for 30 seconds and drain right away. Plunge them into ice water to stop the cooking process and drain. Trim and discard ends of each onion, and slip off skins. Add these to jars and let them pick up some of the pickling taste.




