

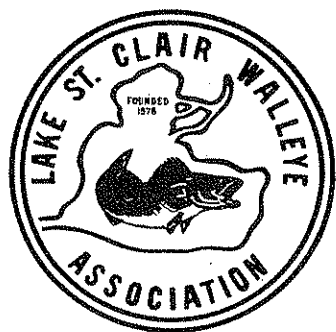

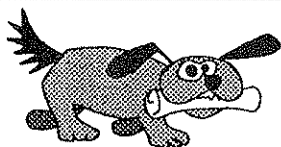

FISHING REPORT

There certainly is no safe ice in this corner of the state so the potential for ice fishing has ground to a halt. To make matters worse many of us have put our boats away for the winter.

However, reports keep coming in of good fishing on the open water.

From shore some of the anglers are catching perch. When legal access is available they are going out onto docks and seawalls. The best combination is light rods and small lures and many of them are using their ice fishing equipment. The preferred bait is wax worms on the ice jigs. The bad part is that the perch are running small and some guys are saying that they will only be able to keep 20 good sized perch out of a total catch of 75 or more fish.

Shore fishing is producing a few Walleye along the St. Clair River. This has been an on & off bite with it in the off mode most of the time. Also, there are still some boaters out on the upper river going after Walleye.

In the upper Detroit River fishermen were going to the Canadian side, just above Peche Island to get limit catches of nice sized Walleye. There were no reports of catches on the Michigan side of the river. Lower Detroit River reports are for nice catches by jiggers. These reports extended out into Lake Erie with good catches reported out of Brest Bay.

Even if you cannot make it out onto the water this warmer than usual weather is being put to good use. Prep the boat for the warmer water season. Do the repairs or maintenance now instead of waiting till March. That way when spring comes in full force the boat will be ready to go.

KID'S ICE FISHING

This annual event is scheduled for February 18th. Even though it seems that winter has forgotten about Michigan the Kid's Ice Fishing event is still scheduled to go on. We will be notifying the membership of any cancellation in both the February newsletter and on the club phone.

VHS: IT'S WHAT WE CAN'T SEE THAT'S THE REAL PROBLEM

Viral hemorrhagic septicemia (VHS) is a new virus in the Great Lakes that has caused wide spread fish kills in sensitive fish species, but is not fatal to humans.

VHS kills fish by causing internal bleeding and prior to being found in the Great Lakes it had only been seen in saltwater species. Recently the US Department of Agriculture Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA APHIS) made a decision to restrict the interstate movement of fish within the eight Great Lakes states. This order is seen by experts as doing little to no good in protecting the Great Lakes from the further spread of VHS in the Great Lakes and the Natural Resources Commission has passed a resolution requesting that the USDA APHIS amend the federal order.

The emergency federal order issued Oct. 24 by USDA-APHIS prohibits the movement of 37 fish species between the eight Great Lakes states and also prohibits the importation of those species into the U.S. fish from Ontario and Quebec. Intrastate movement of fish is permitted, along with the importation of fish into the Great Lakes region from areas outside the regulated zone. The order was issued to protect aquaculture facilities from VHS.

The NRC resolution requests the USDA-APHIS to 1) immediately amend the emergency order to allow a) the interstate movement of fish to slaughter facilities in any other state in the U.S. for subsequent human consumption only, so long as such facilities have appropriate waste treatment; b) the interstate movement of fish within the eight prohibited states based on the regulations of the receiving state; c) the interstate movement of fish to any other state in the U.S. provided that the state competent authority for aquatic animal health has certified the originating facility and that the testing program meets the requirements of the receiving state; and d) the movement of fish to research/diagnostic laboratories if the state competent authority for aquatic animal health approves of the movement and approves the facility into which the fish will be moved; and 2) immediately issue a second emergency order that bans the uptake of ballast water in any area of the Great Lakes where VHS has been found.

It is still not known how VHS entered the Great Lakes, but it is likely that the disease may have come from the ballast water discharges from ocean-going ships. Congress has still refused to pass ballast water protections that would require the mandatory treatment of ballast water

and of ships classified as NOBOBís (ships claiming no ballast on board, but who still have the potential to carry new invaders in the sludge and residue remaining in their ballast tanks). Invasive species, cost the Great Lakes region billions of dollars every year to manage. Scientists have, for the most part, stated that once an exotic species is here, there is no getting rid of it. The introduction of VHS, a new virus before only seen in saltwater species, opens up the potential for a whole other class of invasive-invasive disease and pathogens. We can't see them and will only know they exist when damage is done. They may be a much larger threat than the invasives we can see, making it even more imperative that Congress pass the ballast water provisions currently in the National Aquatic Invasive Species Act (NAISA) NOW!

RECIPES

The pickle recipe is one that I found over a year ago. It originally showed up on the Michigan Sportsmen message board on the InterNet. I did put a version on the LSCWA's message board in the Recipe Section.

Robert is a walleye fisherman but he does most of his fishing on the west side of the state. He has made an occasional trip to the Saginaw Bay area. There are many lakes and rivers that have natural and planted populations of Walleye throughout the state and his success is proof that these plantings often work.

REFRIGERATOR PICKLES

by Robert Snarski (also known as SFW1960)

- 2 quarts water
- 1 quart white vinegar
- 1 cup pickling salt
- 5 pounds cucumbers
- 1 bunch fresh dill
- 1 head garlic
- 1 Tbs minced dried garlic

Combine water, vinegar and salt. bring to a boil - add minced dried garlic. Remove from the heat and refrigerate overnight in glass or plastic jars. The next day scrub the cucumbers. Put some dill flowers and at least 5 peeled garlic cloves into each canning jar (I like to add peppercorns too). Pack cucumbers into jars nice and tight, cover with cold brine, secure lids and refrigerate at least 3 days.


NOTES : These need to stay in the fridge, but they're crispy and delicious!

Play around with the recipe, adding your favorite spices and herbs. These can include a 1/2 teaspoon of pickling spices in each jar or a pinch of dry mustard.

Try making "Hotties" ~ Like adding jalapenos and cracked red pepper, cayenne, or habanero.

Cucumbers can be cut into quarters to make spears or packed whole.

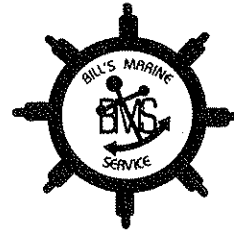

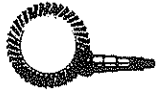
