Parents and guardians should register their kids and pick up the ice rods and lures (until supplies run out) at the pavillion behind the building.

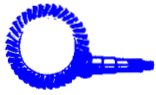
- All children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

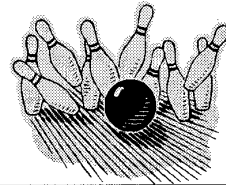

When the doors open at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 28 at Rock Financial Showplace, 46100 Grand River Ave. in Novi, Michigan's 1.37 million hunters and anglers can see an all-new Outdoorama.

ICE SAFETY

Ice is never completely safe. Be careful out on the ice. This safety percuation brings to mind several instances of where people forgot to pay attention just within the last week of January. In the area near Cotton Road a snowmobile being operated by a teenage girl went through the ice. Luckily the water was only 18 inches deep. Also there were reports that enthusiastic drivers parked their vehicles on the ice at the Fair Haven launch. The ice was about 7 inches but because they were parking so close together the vehicles went through. Some of the vehicles could only be retrieved with the help of tow trucks.

BLACK RIVER RAMP REPORT

At the January meeting a club member wanted to know if one of the Port Huron or Black River ramps was going to be closed down. Ray Kalicz and Lou Thomas looked into the rumor and were able to track it down.

There are two ramps in the Port Huron area. One is near I-94 and the other is on Water Street. After several phone calls Ray found out that the Water Street ramp is scheduled for some much needed repair. This work is to start this spring. The ramp is not scheduled to be closed during the maintenance and repair work. At the most only one area will be shut off and the remaining part of the launch will still be usable by the public. The work is to be finished this year.

The ramps are part of the township or city property and are not within the DNR Public Access Sites. Up to now there has been no charge to launch boats. There is a proposal under consideration to charge a nominal fee comparable to what is paid at other ramps. This fee is still proposed and has not been decided on. Ray wanted to assure all club members that if there is going to be a fee he will let the club know right away.

WATER MONITORING PROJECT

from Brock F. Howard

(This article was forwarded to the club from Brock Howard in response to an eMail sent by Dave Wilemski. Brock F. Howard is from the Michigan Dept. of Environmental Quality, Water Bureau, in Lansing. The question that had been asked was about the location and function of an underwater monitoring station that had been installed in the St. Clair River.)

This is referred to as the Real Time Monitoring Project in the Huron to Erie Corridor. The various locations are in the water treatment plants along the St Clair River, Lake St Clair and Detroit River. They include Port Huron, Marysville, St. Clair, East China, Marine City, Algonac, Ira Twp, New Baltimore, Mt. Clemens, Grosse Pointe Farms, Waterworks Park (Detroit), Southwest (Detroit) and Wyandotte.

The equipment being used includes fluorometers, gas chromatograph/mass spectrometer, total organic carbon analyzer, and multiparameter probes. This continuous chemical monitoring system has many functions including chemical spill detection, ambient water quality data to improve treatment, water quality changes due to runoff and water shed activity.

ONLINE NEWSLETTER FOR SOUTHEAST MICHIGAN FISHERIES ACTIVITIES

A new online newsletter that details the fisheries activities in Southeast Michigan, specifically in the Lake Erie Management Unit (LEMU) is now available on the Department of Natural Resources Web site. The newsletter can be found at www.michigan.gov/dnr and then going to the Fishing Section.

"This document is intended to inform anglers about fishery management activities and surveys during the 2007 field season," said LEMU Supervisor Gary Towns. "Lake and stream fish surveys, along with fisheries habitat construction and evaluations, are included. We hope to make this an annual publication which will keep anglers updated on what we have been doing to manage fish populations in this area."

Largely authored by DNR Fisheries Technician Dennis Tar and Fisheries Biologist Jim Francis, the newsletter is a collection of specific findings from fish surveys on local waters and of fish plantings and other activities conducted in 2007 in all or part of 10 southeastern counties of the state. The LEMU includes all or part of Sanilac, St. Clair, Lapeer, Macomb, Oakland, Livingston, Wayne, Monroe, Lenawee, Hillsdale or Jackson counties. The LEMU manages lakes and streams within the Black, Clinton, Huron, Rouge, Raisin, Pine and Belle river watersheds.

The newsletter will also contain information on fishery activities on the Great Lakes waters in southeastern Michigan, including the Detroit and St. Clair rivers, Lake St. Clair and Lake Erie.

The newsletter will explain why certain samples are taken in fish surveys and what the resulting information can tell the DNR fisheries managers. The history of fish management on some lakes and streams also is included. This collective information leads to specific actions like fish plantings, special regulations on some waters, and the protection or rehabilitation of certain habitats.

Anglers are also reminded that fish survey reports on most public waters in Southeast Michigan are available from the DNR's Fisheries staff at the Southfield Operations Service Center upon request by calling 248-359-9040.

Anglers also should note that a map showing the walleye regulations for the 2008 fishing season on the Detroit and St. Clair rivers, Lake St. Clair and Lake Erie - for Michigan, Ontario and Ohio - is also posted on the DNR Web site under the Fishing section.



"There is excellent access to the ice by using the DNR Public Access Site program. These launch sites are located along the St. Clair River and the shore of Lake St. Clair. There is a daily charge of \$6 per vehicle. For those who use these ramps several times over the ice or boating season then a \$24 annual pass is a good option."
