

TIE YOUR OWN STINGERS HOOKS

While there are many pre-tied stinger hooks on the market, they usually have too small of hooks and are too short. Tying your own stingers to the length you need and with premium hooks is a great inexpensive winter project that can put more fish in the boat this spring.



To start you will need some #8 red treble hooks. I like the Daiichi Bleeding Bait hooks. You will also need line. I use Seaguar fluorocarbon 15 pound test because of its durability. The final thing you'll need is a can of Plastic Dip from the hardware store.

Begin by making a jig from a leftover 1x4 board and a few brads. You can place the brads to make any length of stingers you want. I make mine ether 2, 3 or 4 inches long.



Step One: Tie a #8 hook on to the line using a Palomar knot.

Step Two: Place the bend of hook on one brad of the jig and loop around

the second brad. Step Three:

Take the stinger off the jig, and tie a Surgeon's loop knot ware you looped around the second brad of the jig.

Step Four: Dip the loop end into the can of Plastic Dip and hang to dry.

You now have some custom made premium stinger hooks for the spring.



The first one is a very basic fish patty recipe and it still has a lot of flavor and a good texture. Phil has been making this for years and everyone has praise for them. Up until last month Phil would put his recipe together just by looking at the ingredients. He finally wrote the recipe down when he made a batch to bring to the January meeting for a taste testing.

Curt has been making his chowder for a long time. He has perfected it and recently he made up a batch for a gathering of fishermen and the guys at the K of C hall. It went fast and they scraped the pot clean. This is a great way to use the cheeks that so many of us store in the freezer.

Walleye Patties

from Phil Russo

Ingredients:

1lb. walleye fillets

box Uncle Ben's long grain and wild rice
3/4 cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs
3/4 cup parmesan cheese (grated)
1 strip saltine crackers (crumbled)
3 green onions (sliced thin)
2 eggs

garlic powder, salt and pepper to taste

Instructions:

Prepare rice according to instructions on box. Boil walleye fillets. In a large bowl combine all ingredients, form into patties (they will be a little hard to work with), saute in olive oil until golden brown. Best results if you let walleye fillets and rice cool before using. Feel free to make any changes you please but let me know if you improve on this recipe. Like many of my recipes this was trial and error.



Hotwired's Walleye Cheek Chowder

from Curt "Hot-wired" Kratt

- 1/2 cup chopped onions
- 2 1/2 cups diced potatoes
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1 cup chopped carrots thin
- 2 tsp. salt
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup light cream
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 4 slices bacon
- 1 lb of walleye cheeks (cut smaller if desired)
- * Fry bacon & keep drippings
- * Cook potatoes, carrots & celery in 2-3 cups of water until almost tender
- * Cook onions in bacon drippings
- * Add onions, cheeks & crumbled bacon to vegetables and water and simmer 10 minutes, add salt & pepper
- * Stir in milk & cream
- * Bring back to simmer for 30 minutes stirring occasionaly

If you want more liquid add half and half.
