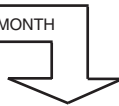

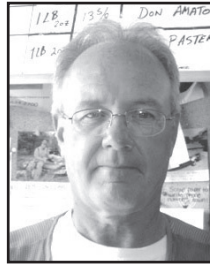

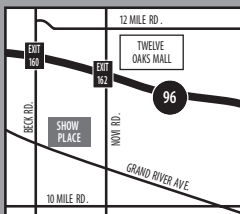

ADVERTISER HIGHLIGHT St. Clair Flats Taxidermy

The other day I had a chance to stop at St. Clair Flats Taxidermy and speak with the owner Paul Burczyk. What an eye opening experience! Paul is the original owner of the shop which opened in 1986. Paul said the



burned out party store and lot were not all that impressive back then, but the location right on Pte. Tremble (M-29) was great. He built the existing building around the old party store and then removed old walls later. For the first 7 or 8 years, Paul lived upstairs in the two story structure that now serves as a storage area. Paul admits that now that his business has grown, he could use a little more space for his two employees and himself, but he is more than content staying right where he is.

I spoke with Paul extensively about his business and how he got started in taxidermy. When he was still in high school, he received a duck mount for his birthday and thought to himself "I think I could make money doing this". Paul now does between



700 and 800 mounts per year, including some rather odd mounts such as the hamster he did last week and a wallaby from New Zealand (see picture to right) he did a while ago. Paul's business is about equally divided between



fish, waterfowl, deer mounts and miscellaneous. He says that fish are the most difficult because of the skin thickness and the painting required. I noticed maybe 20 fish hanging up near the ceiling that were mounted and in the drying process. They were not much to look at, but after the final painting and finishing touches, they will become beautiful mounts.

Paul has been a LSCWA member for the last 15 years. For the last 8 or 10 years he has donated fish mounts to members such as Mark Matyszewski who won the LSCWA Kids Fishing Day at Lake St. Clair Metro Park last summer.

The next time you are driving up M-29 in Algonac and you see Paul's taxidermy shop, stop in and say hello to a fellow member and check out the amazing mounts in his store front. Better yet, stop in with your latest 10 or 12 pounder and let Paul preserve that memory for you.

Just got word from Captain Dan at Lakeside. He went to Canada the same Sunday as our kids Ice Fishing outing. His party killed the perch, all 10 to 13 inches. The ice was 24 inches thick and over 24 feet of water they were hitting on beads only. No live bait. They all limited out before they got too cold. Now this is something I should look into.

You have to stop in at Lakeside, 10 & Jefferson to buy your 2014 Canadian Fishing Lic and get the low-down on just what to use to catch these Jumbo Perch.

Ice is for Cocktails

I'll say it right up front, I don't go ice fishing. So what do I do in the winter so I don't go crazy waiting for spring? I get all my equipment ready for the upcoming open water fishing season, that's what I do.

The first thing to do is take all the reels off my rods. I then check every rod guide on every rod with a Q-tip, the cotton will snag in the slightest crack, to make sure they not cracked or broken. If they are broken, get the guide replaced now, not when you'll need it in the spring. Next get a bucket of warm soapy water and wash all your rods from handle to tip. This will get a lot of grime and fish scales off of the rods and you'll get a better grip on them next season. Lastly put a coat of car wax on the rod to protect the blank and help keep dirt and scales off. Remember, don't wax the handles!

I then turn my attention to the reels. If any of the drags on your reels are getting sticky, send them off to get fixed ASAP, or do it yourself if you're mechanically inclined. I also wash all of my reels down, those darn scales. The reels with Fireline or other super lines, I'll check the line to make sure it's not fraying or faded too much. If it is, I replace it. Don't forget to check the clickers on your trolling reels, sometimes they get broken or damaged and need to be repaired.

The reels with mono, I just strip all the line off and replace with new line at least once a season. Here is how I do that arduous chore. Place your reel in a secure reel base, you can make one or Berkley makes a nice reel and line winder combo. I then tie the line from the reel on a screwdriver and place that in my cordless drill, instant line de-winder! This setup will strip the line off your trolling reels faster than you can say Lake St Clair Walleye Association ten times. Remember when refilling your reels, to fill all your reels up to capacity, so the gears and line counters work properly.

Now is also the time to gather all your baits, safety equipment, rain gear, and other equipment, and separate it into two piles. One pile is stuff that doesn't need any repair or replacement. The other is for equipment that needs to be repaired, replaced or thrown out.

Some things to look for in the second group are bad/rusty hooks on your baits, torn life vests and outdated flares. Check your raingear for holes or worn spots, remember last year when you got wet in that downpour? Now is the time to shop for raingear, not after it starts raining.

Are there any new baits, rods or reels that you need or want? Start shopping for bargains on them now, not later.

Now is also the perfect time to start tying crawler harnesses, making shanks, and making or painting jigs. Order hooks and other terminal tackle in bulk that you'll need from Lakeside, Stamina or other discount tackle stores.

There is plenty of fishing related stuff to do in the winter. You just have to get organized and do it.
