FISH REPORT FOR '09

At the Outdoorama this year Keith Krych and I caught up with Gary Towns, DNR Fisheries Biologist for SE Michigan. We discussed several topics that will be of interest to the LSCWA members.

Gary Towns mentioned that the DNR Fisheries department has been unable to find an active case of the VHS in Lake St. Clair or the connecting waters in two years. This does not mean that the problem has gone away, just that they have not found a sample. The virus is still present and could become a problem quickly just as it did before. The department now has a test to quickly determine if a fish or fish eggs are infected and they are ready to use the test. See the report on the Ponds by Dave Marcelewski that is in this newsletter.

We asked Gary if the Walleye fishing in our area will be as good this coming year as it was last year. He said that for the most part the answer will be "No, it will not. But, the fish that get caught will be bigger." We are still working off of and catching Walleye from the 2003 Year Class hatch. The hatches after that have not been as good as the '03. There might be some good news for the '06 hatch because of the increase in the number of under legal sized Walleye that were caught and released last October. We should know more about this later in the year when the department gets the opportunity to do more samples.

Gary wanted to remind us about the Angler's Diary program. Interested fishermen can get a copy of the diary. They would then fill it in each time they go fishing. You are asked to record information about your fishing trips on the St. Clair River, Lake St. Clair, the Detroit River and Lake Erie. The information provided will assist in the management of fisheries and water quality. If you would like to participate please contact the Lake St. Clair Fisheries Research Station at 33135 South River Road, Harrison Township, Michigan 48045 or call them at (586) 465-4771.



TOURNAMENTS

This time of year is big for local Walleye tournaments. The LSCWA is involved in several of them because the crew is responsible for the weighing in of the fish. People interested in fishing these events will notice things like "Mystery Fish" and "Blind Draw Teams" and might wonder what they are.

When weighing in fish the participant gets the slip with his or her fish's weight on it. When it is time to determinine the Mystery Fish the sponsors or the weigh-in crew will randomly draw the weight slip from those for the fish entered. This person wins the prize. It is an opportunity for everyone who enters to get some of the prize money no matter how large or how small their fish actually is.

The Blind Draw Team is another part of the event that is randomly determined. When it is time they will start to randonly draw the weigh slips and list them on the board as the first person in the team. After the first third they start drawing for the second person on the team. Then, they start to draw for the final person on the team. Once done the weights of the fish entered by each person are added together for the team's weight. Finally, all the team weights are compared and the team with the highest combined weight is the first place team. This gives everyone another chance at winning part of the prizes no matter what the size of their Walleye.

Entering and fishing these local tournaments and events is a lot of fun. So is helping out on the weigh-in crew. Contact Geoff Regulski if you are interested. The upcoming springtime tournaments include the Jigger's Tournament on April 26th, the Sinbad's Walleye Palooza on May 2nd, and the Bill Rose Memorial Walleye Tournament on May 17th. OUR PONDS AND V.H.S.

Well, It's that time of the year again. Time to fill our fish ponds but there is a small problem.

We will not be getting any walleye fry to put in our ponds again this year. That is because of VHS, Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia.

The Department of Natural Resources dictates who gets walleye fry and where they are planted. VHS has put a halt to all planting of walleye in Michigan. The fry are all taken from Great Lakes tributaries. They are all considered "Hot Spots' for VHS.

The DNR had a 60 day test to test for VHS. They say they need a 6 day test. The DNR, along with Cornell University have come up with a 6 day test. The problem is that VHS has not showed up in 2 years. So they cannot test the test to see if it is works. It gets a little confusing I know.

The DNR biologist, Gary Towns, thinks it is just a matter of time to before we will be again planting walleye here in southeast Michigan. But it will not be this year.

The ponds will run, business as usual, except we will not have any fry to put in them. We will fill our ponds and do all the usual maintenance that is required to maintain healthy ponds. We need to continue running these ponds so they will be ready when the DNR gives us the OK to raise fish.

NO ICE FISHING!???

Because my Asthma condition has worsened the past year, this is the first year I can remember that I did not go out and try to trick a perch or two to bite the hook. Ever since I was seven years of age I wandered out onto Anchor Bay, chopped or drilled a few holes in the ice and caught some yellow belly perch to have as a dinner or two the following week. That is like 58 winters of ice fishing.

I watch with my binoculars as other fishermen catch perch with my name on it.

This has been real torture for me this winter. What to do? What to do?

One idea is to place a permanent shanty out there and buy a used covered 4-wheeler to zoom out and park next to the shanty before the cold air affects my lungs. (5minutes of cold air can cause me to almost stop breathing).

Unfortunately, I remember a few years back when my nephew Sam Tews and his dad Mark built a nice wood shanty, painted it red and placed it on Anchor Bay near Tips Bait only to have it stolen a few days later. People just do not leave others property alone like they did in the old days. Lansing should make it a five year felony for stealing an ice shanty (but they won't)

What to do? Maybe next year?
