The LSC Classic with Team N-aut-icole



We spent the week before the LSC Classic prepping the boat, cleaning, maintenance & checking up on everything, rods, reels, safety gear etc. We had our game plan all set, hit our usual spots, whack 'em...stack 'em, good to go! Then we went pre-fishing, and we were like where, oh where did the fish go?

We burned 20+ gallons of gas running from spot to spot, the fish were just not biting for us, talking with some friends I quickly found out they had the same results on the day before the tournament. I still scoured weather & satellite maps, read reports and more. Putting my worries aside, I went and conducted the captains meeting with other board members.

The morning of the tournament Nicole Benson, Dick Benson and myself were some of the first to arrive, watching team after team check in and be inspected. We had to wait for our special guest, Jenny Ciolek from Michigan-Out-Of-Doors, to arrive and get her gear situated onboard.

Leaving the harbor at 5:54 I turned into the wind & waves heading SSE to one of my honey holes. The wind was a little more than expected, making for a bumpy ride in my 2050 Authority. 22 mph across the lake we went, taking roughly 40 minutes to arrive. Nicole, Dick and myself quickly got the rods rigged and set up with Offshore planer boards, the poor bite from the day before was soon replaced by a very aggressive school of walleye.

We caught many walleye very quickly, near the pack of boats off this very popular area, just not much size to

them. We were working our way out of the pack to head to the north and possibly move. Jenny caught a lot of action, walleye after walleye, a few doubles with small-mouth bass and yellow belly perch in the mix. As we started clearing the pack the size of fish went up a year class or two. Now instead of "eaters" we were catching nice 21"-23" walleye.

Nice, but with quality of competition in our tournament I knew we needed better so as we kicked the idea of a move around we caught a nice fish, just under 4 pounds. Well, maybe we will stay a bit longer...so we did and slowly picked away at better fish. Jenny meanwhile captured some great hook ups, fighting fish to the boat, net jobs and high fives.

We had landed over 20 walleye by 11 am, Jenny took a break from filming for lunch and started digging through my glovebox for her phone, pulling a brand new Bandit out asking what's this? That there is a Slim Shady I told her, hey gimme that, I'll put it out for a bit. 10 minutes later that lure and another lure that board member Pete Kohnen and I collaborated on both got hit. Nicole on one rod, myself on the other we landed a double of 25" fish! Oh heck yeah, it's on! More high fives before resetting lines.

We were well outside the pack now, we still picked away at the fish and minus one little humorous event involving a bored MOOD host and a Terrova foot pedal we continued fishing right up to my fail safe return time of 1 pm. Stowing our gear we made the return run back a bit faster at 26 mph, getting back to Harley by 1:30 to be met at the dock by our MDNR. A quick check of our catch, licenses and pfd's and we were off to the weigh in.

Weighing in at the trailer, Tim Muir, Ray Wauters and Pete Kohnen had the process running smoothly. When we weighed in we took first, soon to be dropped one, two then three spots to 4th where we would finish our second LSC Classic in a row in fourth place.

All in all, it was a great day on the water with my wife and father and one we will surely remember for a long time as our action was captured by Jenny for MOOD tv and will be broadcast on a yet to be determined date.

Summer Time is High Action

Time - Fishing 411 TV

When it comes to walleye plugs, summer time is the right time to be fishing with high action crankbaits. Most walleye anglers are pretty much stuck on the idea they need to be using minnow

diving style baits to catch these cagy fish. It's true that at certain times of year, the minnow diving category of crankbait is lights out for walleye. It's also true that in the warm weather months, walleye react especially well to a completely different style of crankbait I like to call the high action wobblers.

HIGH ACTION PLUGS

High action wobbling crankbaits are typically short, stocky built baits that feature a wide wobble, noisy rattles and these baits excel at higher trolling speeds. The Storm Wiggle Wart and Hot n Tot series of crankbaits are classics that fit this category perfectly. Both of these baits have a great reputation for producing walleye when the water temperatures are 60 degrees and warmer.

The new kid on the block when it comes to high action wobblers would be the Mag Lip produced by Yakima Bait Company. The Mag Lip isn't a new bait, but it's new to most walleye anglers. Mag Lip was designed by legendary lure designer Buzz Ramsey as a cold water plug for salmon, steelhead and trout fishing applications.

The Fishing 411 TV crew has used the Mag Lip to target cold water species countless times in recent years. Species we've caught on video with the Mag Lip includes chinook and coho salmon, steelhead, brown trout and lake trout. To that list you can now add walleye.

Mag Lip is especially deadly on walleye. These baits come in a host of sizes, but the 3.5 size is hands down the one walleye anglers will find best suited to their trolling needs. On 10 pound test monofilament the Mag Lip 3.5 will dive to 22 feet. If you need to go deeper, simply adding a two ounce Snap Weight will get the Mag Lip down as deep as 40 feet!

TROLLING SPEEDS

High action plugs do their thing best at faster trolling speeds. A good rule of thumb is to troll from 2.0 to 2.5 MPH when using these plugs. The faster trolling speed not only increases the action of these lures, it creates a

situation where in walleye need to make a reactionary strike decision. When crankbaits are trolled at slower speeds, walleye will often follow a bait, but not strike at it. Faster trolling speeds force walleyes to "eat" or "go fish" because the bait will disappear into the gloom quickly.

SOLID COLOR OPTIONS

One of the advantages of the Mag Lip series is these lures are currently being produced in over 50 different color patterns. Most manufacturers these days are limiting their stock color options, but Yakima Bait produces these baits in a host of classic colors designed especially for targeting walleye.

A few of our favorite walleye colors in the Mag Lip line include Metallic Silver Clown, Metallic Gold Flame, Metallic Silver Lip Firetiger, Metallic Gold Green Pirate, Metallic Gold Red Lip and Rosemary.

SUMMING IT UP

When the heat of summer hits, plugs that have a lot of action and can be trolled fast are a sure bet for walleye. Nothing covers water or produces more walleye than these high action plugs.

Marinated tuna

1 lb raw tuna, yellowfin if you have it, ahi is good too. I use the frozen stuff from ALDI, cubed into 1/2" pieces.

Mix marinade in a bowl, I use a fork to help break the honey down

2 TBSP Soy sauce

1 TBSP rice wine vinegar

1 TBSP sesame oil

1-2 tsp honey

Pour marinade over tuna in another bowl, stir it a few times, after about 15 minutes it's time to enjoy. I like to top ours with everything bagel seasoning, serve with rice, avocado, edamame etc.

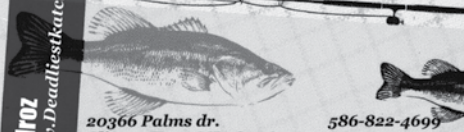
