## ICE SAFETY

It won't be long now(hopefully). The hard water season will be here soon. First ice can be some of the best ice fishing of the winter. First ice can also be very dangerous. Extra caution needs to be used early in the season. Ice may not be the same thickness from one spot to the next. NO FISH IS WORTH YOUR LIFE. Check with one of the local bait shops in the area. They normally will have some info on ice conditions. Use that spud in front of you often. Don't go alone. Its bad enough to get in trouble out there or go thru but if you are alone it can be worse. Get a set of ice picks, Wear a life jacket, keep a dry set of clothes in a waterproof bag, have a throw rope, pull your gear on a sled to spread out the weight. Its small things like that that may save your life. Be safe this winter and good luck. Hopefully Mother Nature will provide us with some decent fishable ice

Waking up this morning to snow out my window makes me sad, not because I have to get dressed and go shovel, no....the real reason is that winter might be here and the boat might not see water again for a while! Fall fishing this year just seemed different, low water levels, scarcity of good bait at times, late weed growth and breakup, warm water late and then a dramatic drop off...lots of factors.

Recapping back to September we held three perch tournaments back to back, weather hampered the first one a little but the next two had great turnouts. Don Murray ended up catching the largest perch of the three tournaments and we will be awarding him a custom replica of his fish from St. Clair Flats Taxidermy.

November 15th found us at Dick Huvaere's Buck Pole once again for an annual tradition. Some great deer were brought in and the LSCWA once again made a donation to the PATH Foundation providing hunting opportunities for those hunters with challenges in the outdoors.

November 22nd brought us the 2nd Veteran's Classic tournament. The weather was a factor at first with stiff winds and rough seas that settled down around 11 am, some boats reported slow fishing while others had great action. When the weigh in was done team Bottom Feeder took top honors in overall weight, big fish and Veteran's big fish. Hardscapes was right behind them in 2nd and team Oh Kay! was third.

I would like to thank Sandra Kozloff of Health Plan & Medicare Choices for her generous donation along with other sponsors Dick Benson, Mark Buckman, Mike "IGGY" Ignatowski of American Legion S.A.L. 326 and Rich Benson. With their generous donations the tournament not only raised \$325 for the Michigan Veterans Home fish fry but we were able to pay out 150%+ of the entry fees along with 66 pounds of walleye fillets for the dinner. # Late Season Success



I've had a difficult time this fall, my time was stretched thin not only by work, outside obligations and losing one of my beloved basset hounds but also

the fishing I wasn't doing, seemed difficult. I say seemed difficult because I wasn't out there for over a month!

Well, with the Veterans tournament coming up I took a few days off to pre fish and prepare , I wanted to give us our best chance possible. I called trusted friends up, scoured my friend's facebook pages, looked at satellite images and more. Why weren't the areas that traditionally gave up good catches producing? Where were the fish?

Night fishing was working for many people, so that led me to believe that maybe it was a clarity problem. Some days the water is just too clear and it seems the walleye just won't cooperate, so I turned to satellite imagery looking for stained water.... I found it way over there on the Kings side. It was then that it hit me, we fished the area I'm referring to for perch but only caught bass, gar and walleye.

Time to burn some gas and seek them out.

Teaming up with two other club members on the Friday before the tournament we made a run over to the area I suspected held fish. We trolled all day, bass, musky and few walleyes but the sonar was loaded with fish all day in addition to active weedbeds. I must have sounded like a madman, I kept muttering the whole way in, the fish are there, they gotta eat sometime, blah blah blah.

Saturday morning I'm still thinking maybe the mouth might be best, maybe jig the river, maybe the Delphine, maybe the yacht club...but then I'm thinking back to the day before and that loaded screen. I'm sticking to my plan, the fish are there, they gotta eat sometime. We headed east with a stiff NNE wind creating a very rough ride in 2-3' waves. We got approximately 2 miles north of the area we perished and the water looked great...

that ghostly green opaque that seems to produce a great bite. More importantly, we were on top of fish suspended 2-5' off the bottom.

Deploying my electric trolling motor to steer the boat and two trolling bags to slow the boat down (wind was 15+) we set lines, running out baits at 12' down. We didn't wait long for our first bite, which then turned into a double. We followed that up with a triple and tangled with a 50"+ musky which my dad fought all the way to the boat ultimately losing it to too small of a net. We picked up two more fish and pulled lines headed back into the waves to set up for another pass.

We passed our original starting spot by a mile, turned the boat back south and set lines again. 11 walleye and a few bass were caught on this pass and as the wind died the bite started to slow so we pulled lines and headed north again. One more pass and we decided on the safe time of 12:45 to pull lines and headed north again for the weigh in. Two more walleye and a couple more bass were pulled in before it was time to pull lines.

Our total for the day was 20 walleye all over 3lbs. My wife Nicole caught the largest once again on "Wild Thing". We ended up placing 4th in the Veterans Classic, missing 3rd by .08 lbs! We donated all 20 of our fish to the MVH fish fry.

Two days later "Fly Rod John" and I returned to the same area and fished it all day, landing 11 walleye averaging well over 4lbs each with a bonus musky measuring 46 1/2" with a very thick girth, estimated the fish to be 30-32lbs!

Trust your electronics and your instincts when you're on the water, you can't catch them if you don't get out there!

## Hotwired's Walleye Cheek Chowder



1/2 cup chopped onions  
 2 1/2 cups diced potatoes  
 1 cup chopped celery  
 1 cup chopped carrots - thin  
 2 tsp. salt  
 1 cup milk  
 1 cup light cream  
 1/4 tsp. pepper  
 4 slices bacon  
 1 lb of walleye cheeks (cut smaller if desired)  
 • Fry bacon & keep drippings  
 • Cook potatoes, carrots & celery in 2-3 cups of water until almost tender  
 • Cook onions in bacon drippings  
 • Add onions, cheeks & crumbled bacon to vegetables and water and simmer 10 minutes, add salt & pepper  
 • Stir in milk & cream  
 • Bring back to simmer for 30 minutes stirring occasion
