March Madness *By Rob Barnes*

When the ice melts off the big lake it's time to target pre-spawn walleyes. I try to keep my boat in a perpetual state of readiness in my attached garage so that I can drop in my batteries and go at a moments notice. The opportunity presented itself on March 10th, 2018 with light winds and mild waves; I have to pick my days with a smaller 17.5-foot boat. I gave my Dad a call the day before to let him know that it was primetime to pull some crank baits on Lake Erie. While I was driving to our destination, he carefully reviewed the latest MODIS satellite imagery to identify stained water and mud lines for targets of opportunity. Many of you know that walleyes love stained water to ambush prey.

Once the boat was ready to take its maiden dip for 2018 we could see right away that we would be busting skim ice from the canals out of Sterling State Park. The ice crackled and crunched like wrapping paper being ripped off of a delayed Christmas gift as we idled toward the bay. I took note of pods

of fish we marked at speed while we motored out to our first mudline. Our starting lineup of bandits, perfect 10s, and husky jerks were ready to go. We staggered our depths until we could establish a pattern for where the fish would smash our baits. This ended up being 8-12 feet down over 18-20 feet of water. Slow trolls at "crawler harness speeds" were all that it took given the lake currents and 35-degree surface temperatures slowing down the walleyes metabolism. My Offshore Tackle OR12 boards have no problem pulling deep diving crank baits at any reasonable speed while maintaining the functionality of their tattle flags. I enjoyed using the flags to monitor short strikes and the all-important adrenaline-pumping, board-burying rip backs. Most of our fish came on metallic colored bandits inside of the mud. At one point we had decided to ride the mudline and place 3 boards on the transition to clear water and 3 boards in the thick of the stained mud. Almost immediately my baits in the mud started to get whacked. First to go was my middle board and as soon as I picked up the rod I could tell it was going to be a big fish. I affectionately call big walleyes 'Trons (short for Megatrons). I cinched down my drag so I could slowly winch in the beast. When we removed the planer board I loosened up on the drag to prepare for the fish to make runs. The fish bulldogged me to the bottom of the lake then made rapid dashes to the port and starboard sides of my trolling spreads. I began to doubt whether it was a walleye. That was until I was finally able to see the cold pale gold of the fish near the surface before my dad swooped her up with the net. I didn't weigh her until I could get her on a certified scale at a local bait store near the launch. She ended up weighing 11.5lbs and is now at St. Clair Flats Taxidermy so that I can have a trophy to remind me of this memorable trip with my Dad. During the battle with the 'Tron we had 2 other rods go off with fish which were successfully landed; both were solid quality walleyes. With a full live well and cold hands we headed back to shore and considered the trip a win. Get excited for the upcoming season because if early season is any indicator of the quality of the fishery we are in for another outstanding year.

THE VERY FIRST WALLEYE POND

Don Murray told me that he got a call from an old member (Ed Raquel) who wanted to turn over some old news clippings about the Walleye Ponds. So I went to meet him at his house where we had a lengthy conversation and I was able to ask him many questions. This is his story as told to me.

It turns out that Ed was responsible for starting the very first walleye pond. In early 1974, Ed owned a tool and die shop in Warren and had just moved to Armada Township. He then decided that he wanted to have a pond so he dug a $\frac{1}{4}$ acre pond on his property. Incidentally, this was the same year that our Walleye Club was getting started. He was not yet a member of our club because it was not started yet. So he and his buddies got together to do some exploring. Ed was the treasurer of the Detroit Area Steelheaders. Ken Pearce was on the Lake St Clair Advisory Committee, Ron Spitzer was with the DNR while Tom Schneider was the Detroit Chapter President of the Detroit Area Steelheaders. They along with ED had all fished the Macomb County streams quite a few times so they went to do some exploring.

Ken Pearce had tried the freeway ponds but found out that they were unsuccessful, so he asked Ed if he could use his newly dug pond to raise some Walleye for planting in LSC to start a spawning run on our side of the lake in the Clinton River. At that time the only Walleye came from the Thames River in Canada and that area was under threat of being blocked by commercial nets. On May 14th 20,000 newly hatched fingerlings were brought by the DNR and planted in Ed's 14' deep pond and it was Ed's job to feed the fingerlings. Someone donated some free barrels of Stroh's beer mash and these barrels were stored on Ed's property so he then fed the mash to the fingerlings. The mash grew to plankton the fingerlings ate well!

Ed's pond was a huge success and on August 8th 4,500 Walleye were taken from the pond - it was the most successful yield for a pond of that size. The Walleye were then released into the Clinton River near his home at 33-mile road where the river path led straight out to the lake. Over the next two years his pond again rendered some better results so in 1977 the Selfridge pond was also dug and the rest is history. Later the LSC Advisory Committee was disbanded and we the Lake St Clair Walleye Association took over the management of the ponds.

So looking back, we all owe Ed a great deal of thanks for helping start the first run of Walleye on the Clinton River - On our side of the Pond.

The Passes Are In

The list for the volunteers that will be helping at the Ponds this year is done and waiting at the building just outside of the gates at the base. All that's needed is you. If you are a volunteer and requested your name be placed on the list just go up to the building on the right as you are going to enter the main gate. Go in and tell one of the ladies you are on the list for the Lake Saint Clair Walleye Association and you would like to get your pass. If you have an old pass turn it in. Next year you will need to return your old pass or you will not be issued a new one. You must have the current registration for your vehicle and the up to date proof of insurance copy for the vehicle as well. That and your driver's license will get you a pass that will be good from April 1 thru Sept 30th. You can call pass and ID at 586-239-6849 and ask for their current hours that do include Saturday.

Please try and get your pass as soon as possible. If you wait until the day you are going to help there could be a backup and in the past it took several hours to get in. Most of our events only last a few hours.

Don't forget while you are in the neighborhood to stop and see Jerry and Sheri at Angler's Point just across from the DNR launch.

Boating Accident Facts

- 76% of fatal boating accidents were drownings.
- 85% of drownings were not wearing PFD's
- 71% of boating deaths occurred on boats where the operator had NO boating safety course. Only 15% of deaths were with training.
- 82% of drownings were in boats 21' or less. (Our size boats)
- Operator inattention or inexperience were the leading causes of water craft accidents. Equipment failure was only third.
- April, October, November have the highest accidents and death rates. (Early and late Fishing season)
- Over 50% of accidents with deaths occur while cursing or FISHING.
- 87% of under 12-year-old deaths were NOT wearing PFD's even when the law required them.
- In 2015 there were 4158 reported boating accidents nationally.
- 2351 were in waves of 6" or less, 1123 were in waves of 1'-2'.
- 3100 were during daylight in good visibility.
- 3400 were in wind of less than 14mph.
- 78% of drownings were males.
- 40% of those had their pants down, open or unzipped!!! (Relieving themselves overboard)

Belle Isle Advisory Committee Meeting

The next Belle Isle Advisory Committee meeting is April 19th, 2018 at 9am in the Belle Isle Nature Center. The committee advises the MDNR on the operation and development of Belle Isle, public input is welcome at these meetings and we have made it clear that the LSCWA is keenly interested in developing a boat launch for public use on Belle Isle State Park. We must keep pressure on them and let them know that we, along with many other fisherman, recreational boaters and the public is interested in gaining better public access to the upper Detroit River and Lake St. Clair.
