President's Corner

Wow, that went fast - not really! It's been four years for me as president of the LSCWA and I'd like to look back on some things that we've done in that time and also where we are possibly headed in the future.



I became president in 2014 after 2 years as VP, Don Murray did a great job before me and is still an executive board member today doing very well as our membership secretary, keeping track of our 275 members for us today. I called upon Don many times for advice, not once did he let me down or other past presidents and board members as well. The execs and board of directors approved my proposal to them to start our own charity bingo at the Rosemack Bingo Hall in September of 2014, as the poker rooms we had

been conducting our fund raising had been shut down and we were without a main fund raiser for our club. Through persistence and hard work, many nights of worry when we first started and we were not seeing any return or loss, things slowly turned around for us. The players opened up to us and cliché as it sounds, the rest is history. We have turned it into our best fundraiser to date, and it has enabled us to do so much more for not only our club members but many more people along the way.

As 2015 passed by we were beginning to see that we could do more for our member's children and extended families. We started sending more kids to camp, four I believe that year, then 8 and now for the past two years, 12 lucky kids have went to camp from the LSCWA. We generously contribute fishing gear and bait to the annual summer camp as well.

Also in 2015, I proposed the idea of a scholarship to our board, which was approved and has turned into the annual Stanley Bydlos Scholarship Award. At first we awarded a single \$1,000 scholarship to a member's qualifying first year college student, then 2 \$500 scholarships and this year we awarded 3 at \$500!

As more time passed we were able to upgrade equipment, replace a few things and sharpen the club's image. We have continued to participate and donate to local charities, especially those that focus on getting physically or mentally challenged people into the outdoors. We also donate to quite a few other groups as our finances allow.

In 2015 we participated in the 1st Cold as Ice with radio station 94.7 WCSX with over 300 people entering and helping to raise over \$6,700 for Detroit Edison's T.H.A.W. fund, helping the less fortunate with their winter heating bills. WCSX then allowed us to use the tents, generators and heaters for our own kids ice fishing outing the next day, making conditions very hospitable for our kids and crew. The next two winters would have us looking at open water on the main lake but in 2018 we were able to hold "Cold as Ice II" once again with WCSX and had a great showing of over 250 anglers competing for Cold as Ice Cash, and again donating the use of the gear to the club for our kids and crew's comfort.

Still more in 2015!...Dick Huvaere, Dodge and Ram trucks teamed up with us to bring about the first May Madness, which has grown from 19 boats the first year to this past years 56 boats with a top prize of \$5,000! May Madness 5 promises to be even bigger and better, count on it!

2016 brought us to our 40th anniversary, not bad for a club that started out as a grass roots effort to get the commercial fishing nets out of our beloved Lake St. Clair. Special copies of our 1st Walleye World were printed and 40th anniversary gear were highlights of our club's "birthday"!

As time went by a few members of the board thought of what could we do to improve our derby and tournament presence? The answer was our club tournament trailer. Tim Muir first suggested it, Keith Krych and I looked a little more into it and after presenting our idea to the board in 2016, the trailer was approved and ordered. Club member Dick Benson has been extremely helpful in not only transporting the trailer, maintaining and outfitting it and repairing and maintaining our original club trailer as well. Today, with the updated club logos on both trailers we have an eye catching presence wherever we take them.

In 2016 after hearing of the need for repairs at the City of St. Clair fish cleaning station, the LSCWA held a fish fry to raise funds and also donated funds to get it fixed. Members donated their time, fish and attended the event. Most recently we have donated to help maintain the Port Huron station as well.

So after all this, what was next you ask? In August of 2017, I challenged our Execs and Board, I wanted us to become MUCC's Affiliate of the Year. Our board responded unanimously and through our efforts, we were able to do just that. On June 23rd, the MUCC presented us with the Affiliate of the Year award for our contributions towards the MUCC kids summer camp, our fish rearing and stocking program with the MDNR, and our many other charitable acts we do.

I would like to think the past four years were good ones for the club, both in the events we hosted, kids we've supported, charities we've helped and more. I couldn't have done it without the help of the execs, our board and our members.

The future of the LSCWA is looking very good. Tim Muir is nominated for president in 2018, he has been my right hand man for quite some time and will not only be a great president but probably the best one yet. Our standing with the MUCC is also held in high regards, as Tim was asked to be on the board for the MUCC's 8th district, to which he accepted. We are also leading the fight for better or improved access to the upper Detroit River and lower LSC. We are asked to not only attend, but also organize and officiate many tournaments.

In closing, I thank all those who have helped the LSCWA get to where it is today.

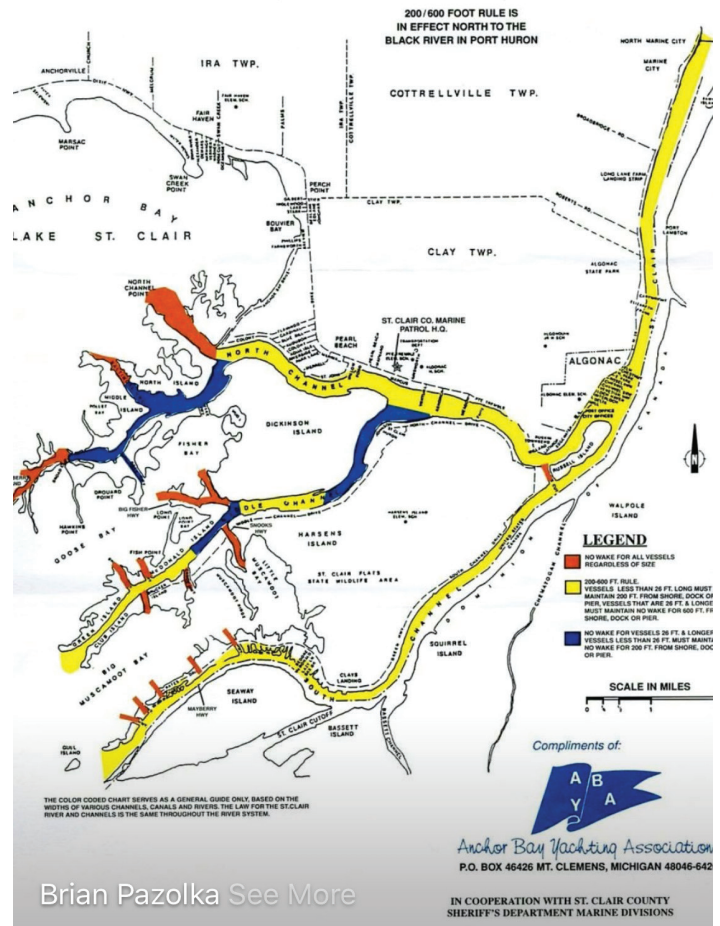

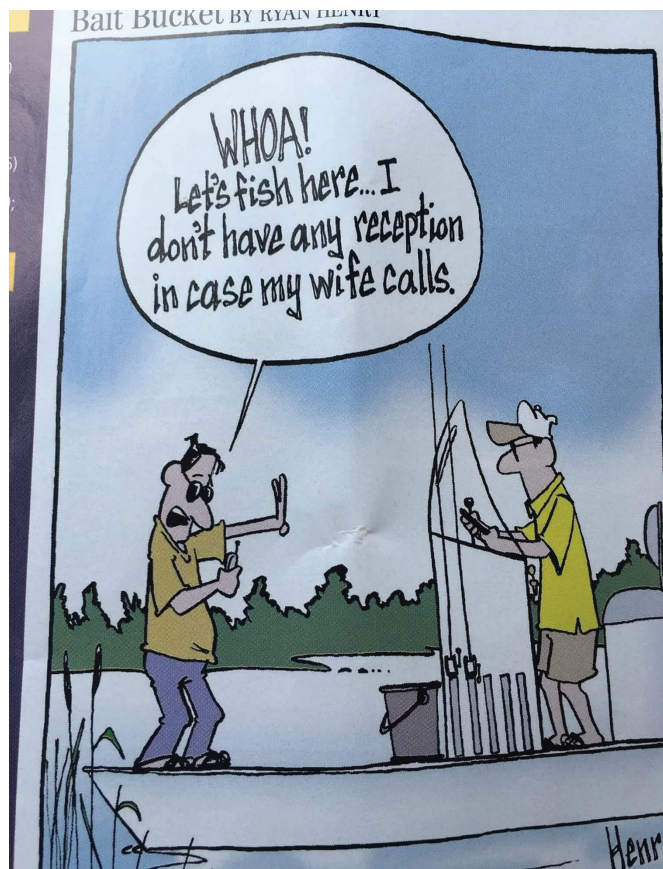

CLEAN YOUR WORMS *By Alex Vitek*

Frequently I hear someone say how they like the success when using crawlers when fishing for Walleye. The down side is that the large worms are frequently packed in a natural soil which tends to stick to their hands and quickly falls off and creates a small mess. Or, the worms are packed in worm bedding which is a mix of shredded and pulverized reclaimed newspaper. While this paper mix will not muddy hands, clothes or the boat floor it can still create a minor mess when it falls off hands.

Several years ago I came across this trick one morning when I had forgotten to include the crawlers in the cooler and had to stop at a bait shop. All that was available were the cartons of worms packed in the rich black dirt which was not acceptable when in Ontario waters. The quick solution was to stop at the first gas station and pick up a couple sheets of newspaper someone had tossed into the trash can. Once at the boat I dipped one sheet into the water. It only takes several seconds for it to soak up enough water. I dumped the container of crawlers onto a dry sheet of paper and washed out the dirt. After ripping some of the wet paper into strips it was put into the container. Remember to continue to watch the crawlers since they have a tendency to crawl off and it is necessary to herd them back towards the center of their sheet of paper.

While moving around the crawlers start to loose the dirt that is sticking to them so it is easy to put the crawlers back into the container where they will stay clean for months. The large worms will easily live in the damp newspaper for several weeks; I have kept them alive for up to 3 months.

Then #1 enemy of thick healthy crawlers is getting warm or getting very wet. Getting warm, drying out or exposure to bright light rank right up there when it comes to ruining good fishing bait. Keep the crawler container in a cooler on ice. Do not leave it on the seat or the floor in the sun or even in the shade on a warm day. Keep it on ice. When not out fishing the best place to keep crawlers is in a very cold refrigerator. The setting on the fridge where I store my crawler supply is 75% towards the "max cold" setting, often around 35 degrees. Other things to keep in mind is not to let the crawlers get to wet. The bedding they are in should be damp but not wet. There should be no drops of water on the bottom of the container. Too much water and the coating on the crawler will wash off. This slimy coating allows them to move easily through the soil but importantly protects in the worm in several ways and this includes keeping them from drying out. It is possible to take a crawler, or even half of one, off a lure and put it back into the container and have it live. It will take several days for it to develop a new slime coating, heal any cuts, and to plump back up. All this as long as it is kept cold and the bedding is kept damp, not wet



The best way to prepare is to rip strips of newspaper up to 2 inches wide. Doing this while the paper is dry is easy, just tear the long way, from top to bottom. This small pile of paper strips, from just one full sheet, is enough to fill two containers



Dip the paper into water just long enough to get damp, just several seconds, and put into the container loosely. These crawler were just as plump and healthy in the newspaper two days after this photo was taken.

Even if it's just practicing that knot you learned, or going backpacking and remembering the lessons you were taught on what to pack, you remember them, and those skills, however small, stick with you.

We did many activities including kayaking; Where we kayaked to a lake which was turning into a bog, fishing; We cast off the dock or bank and I caught a bluegill, archery; Most of my arrows didn't stay on the target, but were accurate, shelter building; We split into groups of three and we had to make a sturdy and waterproof shelter that could fit the three of us plus one more person, and shooting .22's on the range; If I were deer hunting, I would have gotten nine out of ten deer. My favorite activity was probably kayaking. It was nice because we got to see a lot of wildlife including a blue crane.

Time truly does run differently at camp. "When is lunch?" and "What day is it?" These were popular questions there. We may have eaten lunch an hour ago, or thought it was yesterday in our minds. With time seemingly being unlimited, it is easy for everyone to make a friend or two very quickly, and you will surely remember them.

With having time to spare, people would come up with complaints to spare. Though everything does have a bright side. "I want to go swimming, but the lake is cold," You can cool off in the lake so you aren't as hot as you would have been if you didn't go swimming. "I don't want to hike," You get to see a bunch of nature along with a bog and eat wild edibles.

There is nothing entirely like camp; You can simply relax, make friends, and have a good time! I would like to thank the L.S.C.W.A. for sending me to camp, and overall, my experience these past two years at Michigan Out-of-Doors Youth Camp has been amazing, and if I get the chance to go again, there would be no chance of me not taking it.
