First derby of the year was held at Sinbad's on the Detroit River. As usual some really nice fish were brought to the scales. Being a river bite this time of year hand lining and jigging were the fishing methods of choice. Having the April weigh in on the Detroit River was appropriate given the river's status as a world class fishery in April.

Winning the Masters division was Jake O'Hara with a 9.6lb walleye which is also currently big fish of the year so far. Second was Ken Vanarsdale with a 9.14lb fish. Rounding out the top three was Brandy Vanarsdale with a fish weighing 4.51lbs.

Over in the open division top fish goes to Matt Orlando with a 6.40lb fish. Second was Josh O. with a 4.53lb fish and was slightly longer than third place's Michael Boyce's 4.53lb fish.



In the new angler of the year category. Jake is in first place with 5 points, Ken is second with 4 points, Matt Orlando 3 points, Josh O 2 points, and Michael Boyce is 5th with 1 point.

Thank you to Sinbad's for hosting our derby. It was a nice day on the river. A list of complete results will be available soon on our website.



May Meeting Presentation

Our guest speaker in May will be Todd Wills, a research biologist with the DNR. Here is a brief bio:

I've been a fisheries research biologist with the DNR Fisheries Division since 2003...I spent the first 8 years of my career working on river and stream fisheries research at the Hunt Creek Fisheries Research Station in Lewiston. In 2011 I transferred to the Lake St. Clair Fisheries Research Station, and became involved with Great Lakes fisheries research throughout Southeast Michigan. I started my current position as Lake Huron-Lake Erie Area Research Manager in 2015, where I manage both the Alpena and Lake St. Clair fisheries research stations. We are responsible for fisheries assessments and science in Michigan's waters of the Great Lakes from the St. Marys River to the Ohio-Michigan border. In my free time I hunt, fish, or dream of hunting and fishing.

Title of my presentation will be "What's new with Walleye and Perch on the East Side of the mitten?"

Brad was also the tournament director who donated \$500 to the LSCWA for our activities throughout the year.




My Weekend

Have a small "trophy" we can hand out for big fish. I came up with the orange jacket. An old school orange life jacket with the name of the winner and stats from the fish. QUICK 'N EASY WALLEYE

Nothing beats fresh fish, especially the evening of a successful day of fishing. I myself love a nice quick meal or snack right after cleaning them up but don't want to make another mess to clean up so I look to my microwave,....yeah, my microwave!

I was a cook in high school and one of the favorite dishes at the restaurant I worked at was "baked" cod.... but that cod never seen an oven, but it did hit the microwave for 2:35. In fact, talking with others who have cooked at both high and low end restaurants, a remarkable amount of others used the microwave to cook their fish as well. The high water content of fish makes it very receptive to the heat produced in a microwave, with proper attention given to your fish dishes they will come out very good.

One quick dish I love is Old Bay 'n butter. Put a couple portions of fish in a microwaveable dish, a few pats of butter and season with Old Bay. Cover with either the lid or a paper towel and microwave at 30-45 second intervals, rearranging the fish between each cycle. After 2 minutes or so, check the fillet for doneness by flaking it with a fork or knife. Add additional time as necessary.

Walleye cheeks.....the fillet mignon of the fish. I just treated a few of the Battle Creek Steelheaders to my quick recipe of cheeks and it disappeared almost instantly! I took the cheeks from 15 walleyes, a squirt of lemon juice, pinch of garlic powder and threw it all in a small covered bowl. 1 minute in the microwave and our taste buds were treated to an excellent appetizer before we went to the fish fry at the American Legion.

I know some people are screaming blasphemy! at me right now as they read this, but really, you need to try this yourself. Most other recipes that call for baking can easily be adapted for the old radar-range!
