CORBREAD STUFFING RECIPE

I had quite a few people asking about the cornbread stuffing that I used to stuff the gator with for the picnic last month, so here it is, simple and sweet.

2-3boxes of prepared cornbread

-or-

2-3boxes of prepared cornbread stuffing

1 cup each of diced celery, carrots & onions

2 cups chicken stock

1-2 cups andouille sausage

1-2 cups of salad shrimp or crawfish-precooked

Old Bay seasoning

Add your vegetables, sausage and the chicken stock to a large pot, simmer them down for a bit, 1/2, hour or so. Add shrimp or crawfish, turn off heat and cover. Prepare stuffing mix or cornbread, if preparing cornbread crumble it up, stir into vegetables/crawfish mix. Season with Old Bay to taste, use this stuffing for nearly any occasion, it will be very wet. I prefer to place in large casserole and bake it for a bit if not using it to stuff the main course.
