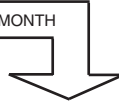

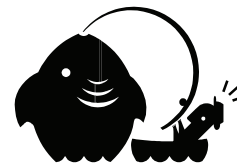

LSCWA KIDS CORNER

I have joined **G.L.E.P.** as a Cruise Leader Volunteer and completed 18 hours of training. I hope to get some of these youngsters to write some articles for our 'Kids Corner'. It should be interesting.

The **Great Lakes Education Program** was designed to provide students (targeting 4th grade) with both classroom and field experiences focusing on the Clinton River, Lake St. Clair and the Great Lakes. Classroom activities include both pre- and post activities that enhance the student's field experience on the water.

The pre-trip activities are designed to review and/or introduce such topics as the water cycle, direct water uses, wetlands, food chains, Great Lakes geography and groundwater. The field portion of the program is a shipboard experience providing multi-disciplinary, hands-on activities that explore the physical, chemical, cultural and biological aspects of these water resources.

The eight learning stations, led by MSU staff, Cruise Leader volunteers, teachers and parent chaperones, include: marlinspike, navigation, marine terminology, plankton studies, dissolved oxygen, carbon dioxide, weather, water temperature, pH, turbidity and bottom sampling.

Samples of aquatic plants and organisms are sent back to the classroom for post trip discussion and study. The post trip activities are designed to review the pre-trip activities and reinforce the field experiences.

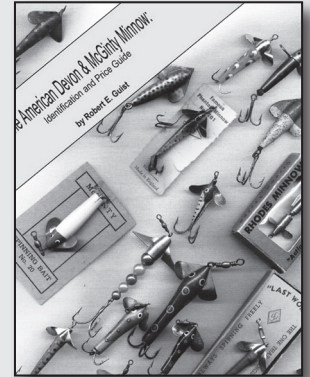

What began as a problem with his Minn Kota trolling motor ten years ago turned into a new line of business for John Cornish and his family. After contacting the factory about his trolling motor, he was told there were no authorized service centers in the area to repair it. His only option was to ship the motor to Minnesota for warranty repair.

After inquiring about what qualifications were required to become a service center, John realized that with his 20+ years of experience in electrical work and electrical contracting, it could be a good fit and addition to his family business. He signed up and went through the required classes.

Choosing a slow start, the factory authorized service center opened in his garage in 2003. As customer repairs came in, whatever parts were needed he ordered them for the repair and more for stock, quickly building the necessary inventory needed to stock a full line of parts so he could offer a 24 hour repair service to Coastline's customers. This was an important factor to John; we have a short season for fishing; it's important to get back on the water as soon as possible! Many customers have broken down during fishing tournaments and have been able to get right back on the water and finish their tournaments.

In 2004 Coastline was approached by Johnson Outdoors, manufacturers of Minn Kota Trolling Motors, Cannon Downriggers and other marine products. They were very pleased with the

service and reputation Coastline was building as a service center for the Minn Kota line, and offered to give them the Cannon service line. After taking the required classes, Coastline became a factory authorized service center for Cannon Downriggers.

The south pond holds 4,729,996.91 gallons of water and holds 632,268 cubic feet of water

The north pond holds 3,787,570.45 gallons of water and holds 506,292 cubic feet of water

The north pond took 24 hours of steady pumping to fill

The south pond took 26 hours of steady pumping to fill

It took more than 100 gallons of diesel fuel to fill the ponds

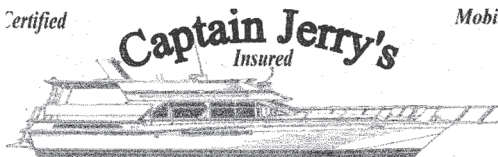
