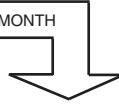

WALLEYE CHOWDER

Ingredients

- 1-1/2 lbs. walleye, skinned and cut into 1 inch pieces
- 4 slices bacon, chopped
- 1/2 cup onion, chopped
- 1/2 cup carrots, chopped
- 1/2 cup celery, chopped
- 3 cups red potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 2 cups chicken stock
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme leaves
- 1 cup Half & Half
- 1 16-1/2 oz. can cream-style corn

- In stockpot, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp.
- Remove bacon and set aside.
- Reserve 3 tablespoons bacon drippings in stockpot.
- Add onion, carrots, celery and potatoes to drippings and cook over medium heat for approx. 10 minutes until vegetables are tender. Stir constantly.
- Add fish, chicken stock, salt, pepper and thyme.
- Bring to a boil over medium heat; reduce to low and simmer covered for 8 to 10 minutes.
- Add Half & Half, corn and crumbled bacon and simmer until mixture is heated through.

Recipe makes approximately 4 servings.
Good with crusty bread.

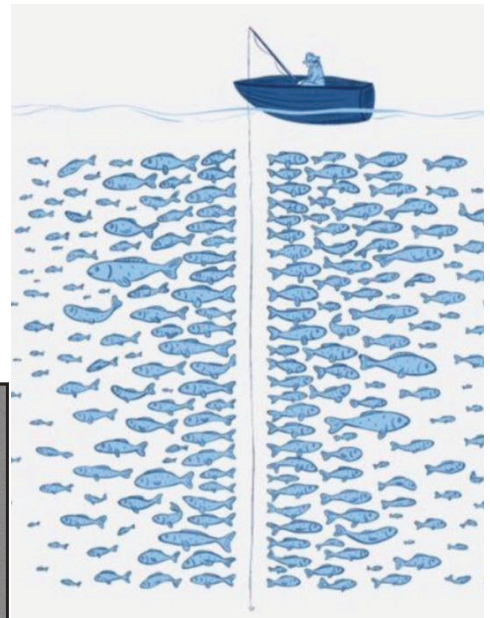
