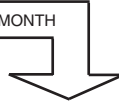

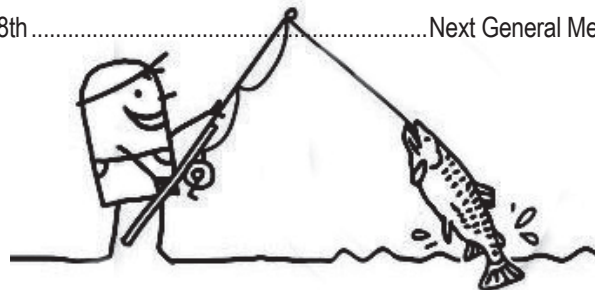

November Fishing Report

With winter arriving ahead of schedule again this year and lots of cold winds it seems that local fishing has been pretty tough. The Detroit River was giving up walleye from the Sturgeon Hole all the way down to Trenton. Best catches are taking place when the water cleans up. Sturgeon hole and Trenton being most consistent with Mid River areas catching a few fish. Perch fishing mid and lower river has not been hot. Anglers however are catching enough for a meal each time out.

Best local bet for walleye right now- St. Clair River has been hot. I am hearing of lots of fish coming from Port Huron area all the way down and including the North Channel. Jigging, handlining, and whipping are all producing great catches. The guys fishing off the wall have been having a great fall too!

Lake St. Clair proper has been pretty quiet for walleye and perch. High winds and dirty water have not helped either. Night shore casters have been having success on walleye when the water is clean.

Lake Erie- Not much to report here due to high winds and dirty water. Guys in Ohio out of Huron area are getting a few fish. I am not hearing of many easy limits. This bite just gets better and better until ice up with night trollers have the most success. Michigan waters are still producing decent perch when the weather allows. Walleye fisherman are still chasing perch in the Michigan waters, I assume that is because the walleye catching has not been producing. Shore casters should be catching fish after dark, Although I am not hearing many reports.

Saginaw Bay & River- Get up there before the ice shuts us down!! Heck get up there when the ice forms! This fishery has been hot, hot, hot for the last month. Night casters from shore in Saginaw River are getting lots of limits. Boat fishermen are catching easy limits both in the bay and river. In the river jigging has been great with casters and people long line trolling all catching fish. Size has also been pretty good. In the Bay trolling rules, although casting shallow in the evenings has been productive too. For trolling you cannot beat Rapala Husky Jerks both deep and shallow divers. Original Rapalas in size 13 & 18 also produce a fair amount of fish, with Reef Runners also being productive. This time of year anything that has a smelt profile works well on the Bay.

Western Side of the state- Not hearing much on walleye, although Muskegon Lake is taking some fish trolling after dark. This fishery usually gets better and better right until ice up. Steelhead fisherman have been doing well all along the west coast. Light fishing pressure makes for a good day on the river and it sounds like the fish are cooperating.

Dress warm and enjoy some of this great fall fishing!

I know a lot of you have SONAR units already, but the newer units on the market are so much better than the ones from just a few years ago, that upgrading makes a lot of sense. A whole new world of fishing opportunities will open up with one of these. BTW, they are usually on sale around this time of year.

When you have your new unit, I urge you to take one of Lance Valentines SONAR/GPS classes. It will be the best time and money you will spend this winter.

Gore-Tex rain gear is another can't be without item on your list. Good rain gear is worth its weight in gold at times. Both Cabela's and Bass Pro have their top of line rain gear on sale right now.

For you trolling fanatics, a good matched set of line counter reels are essential. Many manufactures make them now, and the prices are lower than ever.

The soft side tackle bags that hold individual smaller boxes can solve the problem of having too many tackle boxes with you. You can tailor what you carry around by changing the small boxes inside, instead of having a bunch of the old hard tackle boxes.

Digital scales have also come a long way. They are smaller, more accurate and less expensive. They can also settle that \$1 wager on who had the bigger fish for the day. ☺

A measuring board will come in handy, you don't want a ticket for an undersized fish do you.

How about a new cooler. They come in ultra insulated models that will keep ice frozen for up to ten days. Yeti or Orca coolers can keep your catch fresh for days on those longer trips.

Your loved ones may want to get you a new inflatable life vest. The new ones are now so comfortable you don't even know your wearing them, till you need it.

Ever wonder what was on the bottom of the lake or river? With an Aqua-Vu or other underwater camera you can find out. The kids love to look at things through it, and I'm one of them.

Ice fishing season is here and a nice portable shanty to keep you warm on the ice would be nice.

Speaking of warmth, a portable propane heater like a Mr. Buddy for that shanty sounds good too.

Of course you can ask for a new LSCWA shirt, sweatshirt or jacket, too.

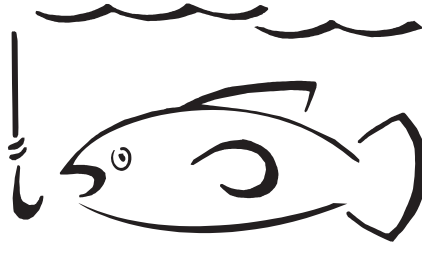
