Later, he was conscious of the Auxiliary and then, was invited to join that group of volunteers in November, 1985. He continues to remain active in the Auxiliary. He currently holds an office in the organization.

Herb remembers joining Flotilla 12-09. He was busy teaching 'boating safety' classes and continues to this day. He continues that profession that he retired from way back in 2005 after 35 years of teaching 'middle school' students in Mount Clemens.

He enjoys teaching 'safety' and 'boat handling' in the boating classes that are held bi-yearly.

Herb often says that he has made almost 'every' error on the water which sharpened his sense of 'safety'. Hopefully, others will learn boating safety from him and his vast experiences that he has gained on the waters of Michigan and the Great Lakes.






