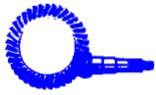

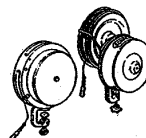

RECIPE SECTION MAKING LEMONADE

Several years ago, the Silver Bass were in the upper Detroit River thicker than usual for their spring spawning run. Catching a limit was easy and often it was possible to get 50 of them before a single Walleye made it to the cooler. Therefore, if life hands you lemons then it is time to make lemonade.

A year or two ago I printed the recipes for canning fish. That was what I did with those Silver Bass. I canned them fresh and smoked. Over the years, I have come across articles on making sausage-using fish. This seemed like another version of making lemonade. The only problem was the recipes that I found involved making the spice mix from scratch.

Last October when it seemed that the only fish I could put in the cooler were Smallmouth. By the time the weekend was over, I had taken home several Bass. More Lemons I thought. They were enough to give me three pounds of boneless and skinless fillets. I stopped by the butcher supply business called Ferrari & Sons in Mt. Clemens hoping that they had a pre-mixed spice package for fish sausage. No luck but I did see a package of spices used for making pizza flavored snack sticks so I bought one.

I cut the fish into chunks and mixed one ounce of the spices with the 3 pounds of fish meat. We then placed the fish into the fridge to marinate for several hours. When I thought it was enough time Loretta tossed the fish pieces with our regular dry powder breading and spread them on a baking dish. We baked them in a hot oven, about 350 degrees, until done. They were good. The next day the leftover pieces were packaged and frozen. I would thaw a small package every couple of days and then could have a pizza-flavored snack for lunch while at work.

A visit to Butcher and Packer Supply in Madison Heights was in order. They did not have a spice mix for fish sausage but the sales clerk told me that people have been using standard sausage spice mixes with success. That is something to keep in mind. Mixes are available for several styles of Italian sausage, Polish sausage and breakfast sausages.

Here is the contact info for the two sausage spice suppliers. Both businesses carry the same lines of major spice mixes and some of their own house mixes. They also have a line of knives and kitchen tools. In this digital age, anyone who likes to spend time in the kitchen might want to consider getting a quality digital scale. This will come in handy if you buy large bulk quantities and want to divide accurately to mix smaller quantities.

Butcher and Packer is at 1780 E. 14 Mile Rd. about a block west of Dequindre (on the south side of 14 Mile Rd.) Their phone number is 248-583-1250. Some might remember this business from their years down in Detroit's Eastern Market district. They have moved so make a note of the new phone number and address.

The Ferrari & Sons is a butcher and restaurant supplier. They were located on Groesbeck just south of 16 Mile for years. They recently moved to their new location further up Groesbeck. The new address is 148 N. Groesbeck and the phone number is 586-790-1800.

A GOOD EXAMPLE OF A BAD EXAMPLE

Well my friends it happened again this year. I live on Anchor Bay, half way between Selfridge AFB and the Salt River. Duck hunting season is under way. There are maybe four or five large rafts of ducks numbering into the thousands; they stay just off my dock to maybe 2- miles out.

During the week of November 10 thru 14, were watching three groups of duck hunters. One pontoon type boat loaded with reeds and camouflage cloth was in the shallow corner just west of the Salt River.

A small sneak layout boat with one hunter was out a _ mile out from Cotton Road. The third group of 3 to 4 people was in a large outboard motor powered fishing boat.

The pontoon boat was cool. They were stationary and we only heard 3- shots from each shotgun one in a while. The hunter off Cotton Rd had his 40 to 50 decoys deployed. He only popped off a max of 3- shots, mostly misses.

On four, different times over three days we observed the fishing type boat driving into the rafts of ducks at a moderate speed while one or two people in the boat were blasting away with shotguns. They were not sportsmen like. Therefore, we called the Report all poaching 800 hotline and filed a report.

Even though we were unable to get a picture or MC boat numbers the DNR said, they will be watching out for these Bad Examples. I hope if you see something like this happen you will have the 1-800-292-7800 DNR number programmed into your cell phone.

I believe this boats Captain looked a little like this.
